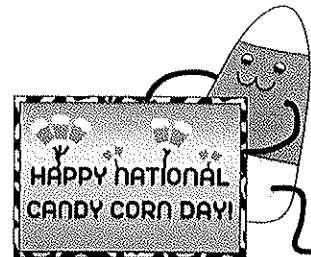

Political signs are **NOT** allowed on housing authority property, therefore, residents **CANNOT** have any election signs posted in their yards. If you have one please remove it.

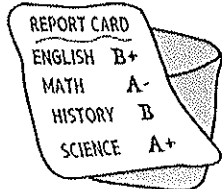


TUESDAY, OCTOBER 30TH

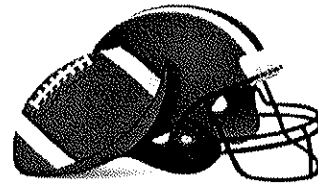

FACTS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- Approximately 42.4 million women in the U.S. have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner at some point in their lifetime.
- Women are much more likely than men to be victimized by a current or former intimate partner.
- Women are 84% of spouse abuse victims and 86% of victims of abuse at the hands of a boyfriend or girlfriend. Three fourths of the persons who commit family violence are male.
- Many batterers' motivation to intimidate and control their victims through the children increases after separation, due to the loss of other methods of exerting control.
- Children exposed to domestic violence often show greater behavioral, emotional, attitudinal and cognitive difficulties compared to those who are not so exposed, but these impacts vary depending on a host of protective and risk factors in each child's life.
- Technology has become a quick and easy way for stalkers to monitor and harass their victims. More than one in four stalking victims reports that some form of cyberstalking was used against them, such as email (83%) or instant messaging (35%). Electronic monitoring of some kind is used to stalk one in 13 victims.
