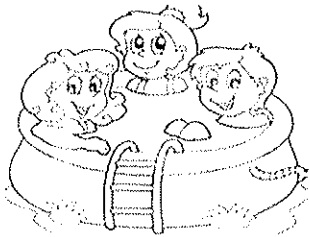

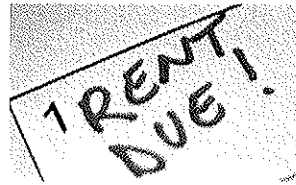

REMINDER:

Summer is here, so we want to remind you that BHA residents **CANNOT** have kiddie pools of any kind (plastic or inflatable). Furthermore, BHA pays for the water and it would put a strain on our budget if these activities were allowed. Please notify BHA if you witness any of these violations.



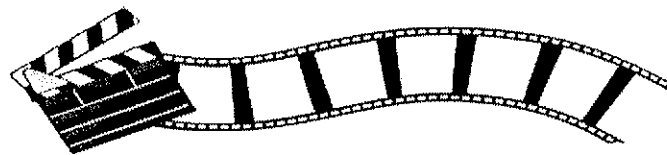
Rent is due **June 12th** which is the eighth working day of the month. If you do not pay by June 12th, a \$10 late fee will be applied. If you signed a contract, your rent is due **June 15th**, but a late fee is still applied after the 12th. The absolute last day to pay the rent is **June 20th**.



Berwick Housing Authority will be taking applications **June 13th and June 20th** from **8:15 am-11:00 pm** and **1:15 pm-3:00 pm**. You **must have birth certificates and social security cards for all members of the household, picture ID for all members over age 18 and current proof of income.**

FUN FACTS:

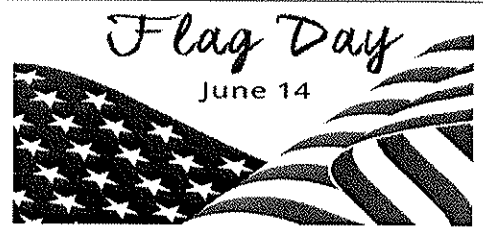
- Less than 2% of the calories in the American diet are supplied by candy.

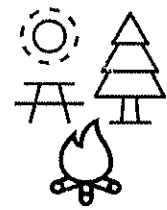
RAISE THE FLAG TODAY AND EVERY DAY WITH PRIDE!

Care and handling of the American flag is steeped in tradition and respect. There is a right and a wrong way to display the flag. This is called **Flag Etiquette**. The American flag should be held in the highest regards. It represents our nation and the many people who gave their lives for our country and our flag. Here are the basics on displaying the American flag:

- The flag is normally flown from sunrise to sunset.
- In the morning, raise the flag briskly. At sunset, lower it slowly. Always, raise and lower it ceremoniously.
- The flag should not be flown at night without light on it.
- The flag should not be flown in the rain or inclement weather.
- After a tragedy or death, the flag is flown at half staff for 30 days. It's called "half staff" on land and "half mast" on a ship.
- When flown vertically on a pole, the stars and blue field, or "union", is at the top and at the end of the pole (away from your house).
- The American flag is always flown at the top of the pole. Your state flag and other flags fly below it.
- The union is always on top. When displayed in print, the stars and blue field are always on the left.
- Never let your flag touch the ground, never....period.
- Fold your flag when storing. Don't just stuff it in a drawer or box.
- When your flag is old and has seen better days, it is time to retire it. Old flags should be burned or buried. Please do not throw it in the trash.

RENT
